



General Data Protection Regulation

Privacy Notice

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into force in the UK in May of 2018 and replaces what is currently the Data Protection Act. GDPR requirements mean all businesses, regardless of their size, must comply with the new regulations. This includes a privacy statement freely available to anyone that wishes to see it. Our statement is below. Statement

Northern Free-style Karate Association is an association of clubs based in Northumberland and Tyne and Wear in the UK. We are members of the Amateur Martial Association <http://www.amauk.co.uk/>

Each of the individual clubs are owned and managed by the individual lead instructors as sole traders.

Each Northern Free-style Karate Association club will collect and process personal data of its members (members of the club who participate in Karate activities) solely for the purpose of providing the karate training facilities that have been requested by way of attending and agreeing to membership of the club. This data may also be used for the purposes of promoting Karate activities that fall outside of the standard training (activities such as tournaments and seminars that will incur additional costs outside of those stated on acceptance of membership - these are always optional), as well as group team building exercises (such as evenings or days out, weekends away or charity events).

Northern Free-style Karate Association will share your personal details with our governing body the AMA for the purposes of registration and recognition of grade, or in order to request outside oversight of karate activities such as a tournament or grading. We will never sell or share any of your details, to anyone, for any reason other than those stated above.

In the event of a concern of child protection, bullying or breach of the Law, your details will be provided to the relevant law enforcement agencies. However this is only in extreme circumstances and only with regards to the protection of our members or their children.

Each Northern Free-style Karate Association club will store their own clubs student's records and details on a secured computer device that is password protected. Access to this data is limited to the club secretary and club instructor and this may be used in case of emergency to contact parents or emergency contacts. All people with access to this personal data are DBS checked.

Paper copies of forms provided are also stored in the instructors registered address, using a locked storage facility. Access to these is restricted to the club instructor and will be destroyed by shredding if the person leaves the club or association following a retention period of 3 years.
